RESOLUTION NO. 847-26

RESOLUTION FORMALIZING AND ADOPTING THE DISTRICT'S PROPOSED DRAINAGE ASSESSMENT FEES

WHEREAS, Panoche Drainage District (the "District") is a California drainage district created in 1957 pursuant to the California Drainage District Act of 1903 (Water Code Sections 56000, *et. seq.*) to provide drainage service to users within its jurisdiction. The District is a multi-county district located on the west side of the San Joaquin Valley, spanning portions of Merced and Fresno Counties, and is authorized, pursuant to the California Constitution and Drainage District Act, to levy rates and charges for the services the District provides; and

WHEREAS, on March 10, 2026, the Board of Directors for the District approved, subject to the requirements of Article XIII D of the California Constitution, imposing land-based charges to fund the District's activities (the "Proposed Drainage Assessment Fees"); and

WHEREAS, the Proposed Drainage Assessment Fees identified two separate fees: one for "Regular" lands within the District, and a fee for "Landlocked" lands within the District; and

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2024, the District mailed notice of the Drainage Service Fees (the "Notice"), which Notice included the amounts of the Proposed Drainage Assessment Fees, the bases upon which they were calculated, the reasons for the Proposed Drainage Assessment Fees, and the date, time, and location of the hearing required by the California Constitution, along with a protest form, to all landowners and owners of record of lands within the District whose lands were subject to the Proposed Drainage Service Fee; and

WHEREAS, the Notice provided that a hearing would be held on the Proposed Drainage Assessment Fees on May 12, 2025, (the "Hearing") at the District Headquarters, and that any protest forms, as provided, must be submitted by the close of the Hearing to be counted; and

WHEREAS, Article XIII D of the California Constitution and the Proposition 218 Omnibus Implementation Act provide that if written protests against the Proposed Drainage Assessment Fees are presented by a majority of the owners of identified parcels in the District, the Proposed Drainage Assessment Fees could not be imposed; and

WHEREAS, on May 12, 2026, the District held the Hearing on the Proposed Drainage Assessment Fees, and invited verbal or written comments and written protest regarding the Proposed Drainage Service Fees; and

WHEREAS, [REDACTED] verbal objection or protest was offered during the Hearing; and

WHEREAS, at the close of the Hearing, District staff confirmed the District received [REDACTED] written protests on the Proposed Drainage Assessment Fees. NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby resolved by the Board of Directors of the Panoche Water District that:

1. The Board finds that the above Recitals are true and correct.
2. The Board hereby finds that [REDACTED] protests were received protesting the Proposed Drainage Assessment Fees and that the District has the authority under the California Constitution and the California Drainage District Act to impose the Proposed Drainage Assessment Fees.
3. The Board hereby finds that the Proposed Drainage Assessment Fees reflect the benefits provided to District landowners for the provision of drainage service to the respective lands.
4. The General Manager is hereby directed and authorized to take all actions necessary and appropriate to effect the purposes of this Resolution.

RESOLUTION IMPLEMENTING THE DISTRICT'S PROPOSED DRAINAGE ASSESSMENT FEES

WHEREAS, Panoche Drainage District (the "District") is a California drainage district created in 1957 pursuant to the California Drainage District Act of 1903 (Water Code Sections 56000, *et. seq.*) to provide drainage service to users within its jurisdiction. The District is a multi-county district located on the west side of the San Joaquin Valley, spanning portions of Merced and Fresno Counties, and is authorized, pursuant to the California Constitution and Drainage District Act, to levy rates and charges for the services the District provides; and

WHEREAS, through Resolution 847-26, the Board of Directors adopted the District's Drainage Assessment Fees; and

WHEREAS, Water Code section 56103 provides that no assessment levied shall become a lien until a certified copy of said assessment and the diagram thereto attached shall be recorded in the office of the county surveyor; and

WHEREAS, Government Code section 54354 provides that a lien may be imposed against real property served for delinquent drainage charges, where the resolution imposing those charges expressly declares that delinquent charges shall constitute a lien upon real property; and

WHEREAS, Government Code section 54354 requires certain procedures be followed in order to impose a lien, including holding a public meeting on the resolution imposing any assessments and providing that delinquent charges constitute liens upon real property before the delinquent charges are levied.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby resolved by the Board of Directors of the Panoche Drainage District that:

1. The Board finds that the above Recitals are true and correct.
2. The Board finds that the Drainage Assessment Fees reflect the benefits provided to District landowners for the provision of drainage service to the respective lands for fiscal year 2026-2027.
3. The Board adopts the Drainage Assessment Fees and instructs the General Manager to implement and levy the Proposed Drainage Assessment Fees.
4. The Board finds this Resolution and the public meeting in which it is adopted are the resolution and meeting called for in Government Code section 54354, and that therefore any unpaid or untimely Drainage Assessment Fees shall constitute a lien upon the land in question.

5. The General Manager is hereby directed and authorized to take all actions necessary and appropriate to effect the purposes of this Resolution.

General Manager Patrick McGowan presented an amended budget for the fiscal year ending February 28, 2027, and noted that due to the San Luis & Delta-Mendota Water Authority (SLDMWA) decreases in their SGMA related costs, there had been an overall decrease to the budget.

After discussion by the Board, this matter was tabled and brought into Closed Session.

REPORT ITEMS

OPERATIONS & MAINTENANCE

Operations and Maintenance Manager Mr. Chris Carlucci reported on the following operations and maintenance activities for the month of March:

- General Maintenance.
- Staff sprayed Hammond and Sabbatti Drain.
- Staff cleaned Sabbatti Drain. (North of DMC to CCID Canal)
- Staff made repairs to the Hammonds Drain crossing pipe. (Shaw Ave)
- Charleston Drainage District – Checking oilers on CH-2 pumps.

DRAINAGE MANAGEMENT

Water Resources Manager Juan Cadena reported on the following drainage management activities for the month of March:

- There has been no activity at Mud Slough, so Site D has continued to remain below the target.

Mr. Cadena also noted that rain is expected this month.

At this time, the meeting continued with Agenda Item 12 – Grassland Basin Authority being discussed prior to Agenda Item 11 – Board to Receive Update from District Engineer.

GRASSLAND BASIN AUTHORITY

The General Manager of the Grassland Basin Authority (GBA) Mr. Palmer McCoy presented the Board with a report on the following activities:

- l). Administrative: • Open position – Advertised for the Maintenance / Spray Technician position as

discussed in February Board meeting. One promising candidate has applied and already holds a QAL certification.

II). Operations and Maintenance:

- New Storage Basins – Late December 2025 storm events saturated the soil profile, causing significant runoff and field ponding across the GBA service area. Diversions from the regional drainage system into the short-term storage ponds occurred from December 26, 2025, through January 13, 2026. All four basins are now in use to alleviate flooding and support project operations. With minimal additional rainfall forecasted, water is being retained in the basins until operational conditions allow for release and reuse for irrigation.
- San Luis Drain – GBA staff continue conducting weekly inspections, debris removal, and repairs to fencing, gates, and signage. The washout repair northwest of Swift Road, completed by Superior Construction, has been reviewed with Summers Engineering; the costs were deemed prohibitive for continuing similar repairs. Weed control efforts remain ongoing.
- DMC Tile – On March 25, 2026, I received a call from a Firebaugh Canal Water District representative reporting that tile F/G was offline and could not be restarted. I contacted Waer Rec for an on-site assessment, which confirmed the tile had been removed. The sump is currently being pumped down to identify the source of sand accumulation. Discussions with SLDMWA continue regarding the transfer of operations and maintenance responsibilities.
- JTWG – We continue to manage irrigation scheduling based on available fields.
- Old Ponds – Ground leveling operations has resumed working with CCID to get survey stakes to help with progress.
- Well Pumping Program - Working with PWD staff to evaluate potential water deliveries for the current year. Water rate discussions are scheduled for the April Board meeting.
- RP9 Siphon – Approved by the GBA Board in October and now fully completed and operational.
- RP3 Rebuild – Approved by the GBA Board in October and now fully completed and operational.

III). Prop 84:

- Awaiting DWR funding updates for the project, expected in late June, or July.
- OD Pump Station – Coordination continues with Garney Construction. Summers Engineering is assisting with the project punch list.
- O'Banion Area – Work has been halted due to funding issues. There is concern that the ripped acres may dry out and harden, potentially hindering future planting efforts. After discussions with local farmer Miguel Cory and Vice-President Western, both agreed this is a legitimate issue and recommended discing the areas. Bids have been received for discing approximately 600 acres, with the lowest bids totaling about \$15,000 per pass. Based on input staff estimates at least two passes will be needed for beneficial results and some area possible three times. This would bring the total to approximately \$35-45K.
- Westside Conveyance & Pumps – Work has been halted due to funding issues. Will be discussed at next GBA Board Meeting.
- Basin Project Phase 2 – This phase includes the middle siphon. License agreements with CCID were approved at the October GBA Board Meeting. McElvaney Construction has completed siphon installation through the Outside Canal and is currently installing control gates. They are working to complete the pipeline from the siphon to the control box for the new basins prior to the funding stop date.

Mr. Palmer McCoy also touched on the Brackish Water Well Recovery Program and then went on to discuss a few other projects such as the ponds, leveling ground, and knocking down the remainder of some levies once Prop 84's funding comes through in July.

BOARD TO RECEIVE UPDATE FROM DISTRICT ENGINEER

Engineer Chris Linneman of Summers Engineering proceeded to update the board on a few ongoing projects for the District. On Prop 84, Mr. Linneman noted that funding is still frozen, but we anticipate having access again in July and right now he and staff are working on a draft final report.

Mr. Linneman also reported that the gates have been closed since March of 2024 for the Grassland Basin Drainers (GBD) and that their annual report is due at the end of April. Mr. Linneman noted that SLDMWA just completed the 2023 and 2024 audit and had found additional carryover funds, resulting in significant reductions in GBP dues to all the member districts. Panoche Drainage District's dues alone were reduced to \$395K. Mr. Linneman discussed a contractual obligation with Newman Land Company that is referenced as Mud Slough/Newman Lake Agreement that addresses what a structure in Mud Slough would look like and how we can get water into Newman Lake.

The San Joaquin Valley Drainage Authority (SJVDA) is mostly running status quo at the moment with Valley Water Collaborative working on various Management Plan reports. Mr. Linneman pointed out that the Expert Panel draft report is out and the comment period is currently open and will be closing on April 30th. GDA forms have gone out to all growers. AB2447 is currently in assembly and the bill focuses on limiting nitrogen fertilizer use, increases monitoring and reporting requirements, and applies quantitative limits on nitrogen fertilizer applications.

Mr. Linneman also noted that the annexation application and MSR have been submitted and comments have been received and addressed. LAFCO is expected to review and approve the application at the May 13th meeting.

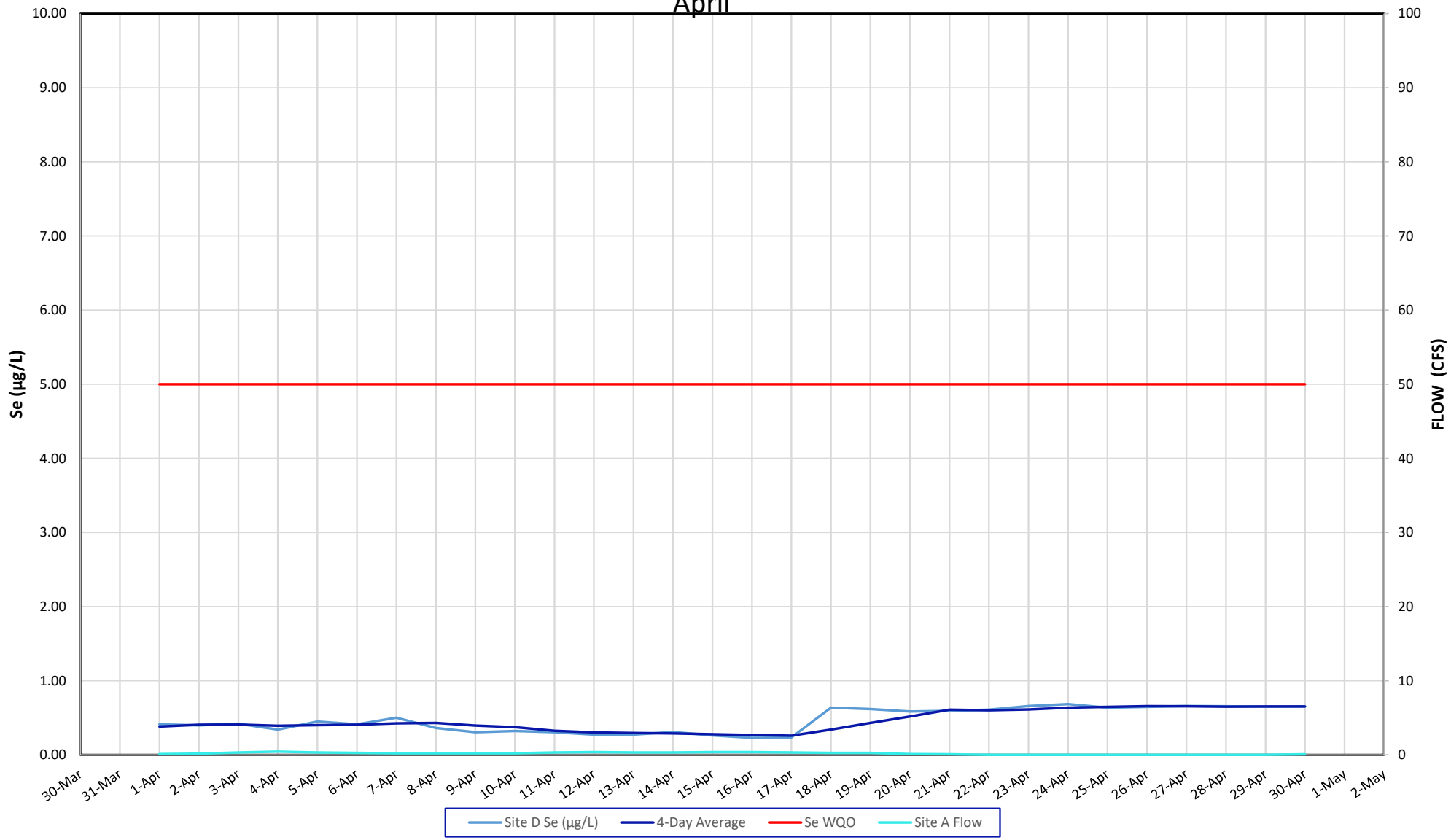

- Staff replaced road crossing on the Buick drain.

General Managers Report

i) Administrative –

- (1) Insurance Claim – A tractor fire occurred on April 20, 2026, resulting in a total loss of the tractor. Staff are currently working with the insurance adjuster to complete the final assessment of the attached disc.
- (2) Water Board Tour - On May 6, 2026 Staff helped the GBA (David Cory, Chris Linneman) host a tour for staff of the State and Regional Water Board. There were seven participants that we gave a tour. The presentation is attached.

ii) Operations and Maintenance –

- (1) New Storage Basins – Storm events in late December 2025 saturated the soil profile, resulting in significant runoff and widespread field ponding across the GBA service area. Diversions from the regional drainage system into the Short-Term Storage Basins occurred between December 26, 2025, and January 13, 2026. All four basins are now operational and are being used to mitigate flooding and support project operations. With minimal additional rainfall forecasted, stored water is currently being released for irrigation use.
- (2) San Luis Drain – GBA staff continue to perform weekly inspections, debris removal, and maintenance of fencing, gates, and signage. Staff are coordinating with Chris L. (Sumers Engineering) to evaluate best practices for liner repairs and are currently exploring the use of Concrete Canvas (www.concretcanvas.us). With the addition of a maintenance/spray technician, weed control efforts are expected to increase moving forward.
- (3) DMC Tile Sumps/Pumps – On March 25, 2026, a representative from Firebaugh Canal Water District (FCWD) reported that Tile Sump/Pump F/G was offline and could not be restarted. Staff authorized Water Rec to complete the necessary repairs, with an estimated completion date of May 10, 2026.

At the April Board meeting, the Board authorized staff to proceed with repairs to the remaining tile systems as needed and to continue coordination with SLDMWA staff. This approach is intended to achieve two primary objectives: (1) address and alleviate impacts to FCWD landowners, and (2) support the long-term transition of the tile sump/pump system back to SLDMWAJTWG – We continue to manage irrigation scheduling based on available fields. First round of cutting started 5/06/2026, market price still seems low but there is potential for an uptick based on water year.

- (4) Old Ponds – At the April Board meeting, staff was authorized to utilize up to \$100,000 from reserve funds to complete the project. Staff is currently coordinating with contractors to determine the most effective path forward and will keep managers informed of progress.
- (5) Well Pumping Program – Anderson Pump removed Well 8 and conducted a camera inspection. Upon receipt of the inspection report and cost estimate, staff will coordinate with management to determine next steps.
Wells 12, 13, and 15 have been operated and sampled. Staff are currently awaiting input from PWD regarding water delivery requests for the current year.

iii) Prop 84-

- (1) Awaiting DWR funding updates for the project, expected in late June or July.
- (2) OD Pump Station – Coordination continues with Garney Construction. Summer's Engineering is assisting with the project punch list.
- (3) O'Banion Area – Work has been halted due to funding issues. There is concern that the ripped acres may dry out and harden, potentially hindering future planting efforts. After discussions with local farmer Miguel Cory and Vice President Western, both agreed this is a legitimate issue

and recommended discing the areas. Bids have been received for discing approximately 600 acres, with the lowest bids totaling about \$15,000 per pass. Based on input staff estimates at least two passes will be needed for beneficial results and some areas possibly three times. This would bring the total to approximately \$45K.

- (4) Westside Conveyance & Pumps – Work has been halted due to funding issues. Will be discussed at the next GBA Board Meeting.
- (5) Basin Project Phase 2 – This phase includes the Middle Siphon. License agreements with CCID were approved at the October GBA Board meeting. McElvaney Construction has completed siphon installation through the Outside Canal and is currently installing control gates. They are working to complete the pipeline from the siphon to the control box for the new basins prior to the funding stop date.
